

Eye See...Eye Learn

Good vision can help your students do well in school

The *Eye See...Eye Learn* program in 6 easy steps...

Step 1:

Familiarize yourself with the *Eye See...Eye Learn* materials. Learn about the importance of identifying and treating visual problems early so children have a better opportunity to learn.

Step 2:

Record the names of your students in the enclosed *Eye See...Eye Learn* Tracking Sheet

Step 3:

Distribute the Parent Information Packages as part of your Early Identification Interviews and mention in your September newsletter.

Step 4:

Use the tracking sheet to monitor which students have participated in *Eye See...Eye Learn*.

Please continue to encourage parents/guardians, who have not already done so, to book an appointment for their child to receive a comprehensive eye exam at various opportunities throughout the year. Reminder notices will be sent in second term to distribute.

Step 5:

A completed copy of the Eye Health and Vision Report (from the optometrist) should be returned to you. Some reports will contain suggested recommendations to assist you and the student.

Step 6:

Consider incorporating eyes and healthy vision into your classroom program.
